iconic novel, *The Fountainhead*, about rebellious architect Howard Rourk, who destroyed his finest creation rather than let it be bastardized, I have been a keen student of epic buildings and architectural wonders. Which may explain why I have been a huge fan of Jenny Okun's architectural photography ever since I first saw her poster for the J. Paul Getty Museum many years ago. I then went to a photographic exhibition of her work at the Craig Crull Gallery in Santa Monica and actually purchased a triptych photograph she had shot of the Grand Canal in Venice, Italy, and it hangs proudly in my cluttered living room. I interviewed her for an article and learned that her first book, *Variations, Architectural Photographs*, gathered more than 90 pictures from 25 years of work, many multi-layered architectural photographs modified in the camera. Famed architect Frank Gehry (Disney Hall) said of her:

Okun and I work in a similar way by intuitively animating forms and capturing movement. Okun's photographs go right to the soul of architecture, allowing us to share her vision of the creativity of the architect.

I was a painter when young while in Horace Greeley High School, and continue to paint and do sculpture to this day as well as take my little pictures. Now I am also doing film projections for the stage, to stretch myself even more.

Coincidentally, I have known her father, music mogul Milt Okun, for many years; he is a long-time subscriber to my Jay Weston's Restaurant Newsletter. Jenny's husband, British writer Richard Sparks, later wrote a screenplay for me based upon a true story of what happened when The Rolling Stones took over a college campus in New England one summer to record an album, and how they changed the local town people and were also changed in the process. (Never made, damn good.) Richard wrote a recent book about Milt Okun called "*Along The Cherry Lane*," which was terrific.

Her new book, *Dreamscapes*, gathers more than 100 photographs taken on-location around the world, 10 countries, many states and cities, with masterly (incredible!) digital manipulation to create unique images that are at once familiar... and yes, otherworldly. Not weird, mind you, just excitingly different. As someone who carries a digital camera everywhere



creating images so fabulous and provocative, a few of which you can see here. She takes landscapes and gardens, nudes, ancient maps, paintings, buildings and sculpture, then — as she says, “I subjectively reinterpret them as I remember them.” After perusing the book many, many times, I can only shake my head in amazement at an imagination which can conceive this stunning work.
